All preferences will be treated equally, but first priority will be given to Looked after children and children who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to adoption, a child arrangements order, or special guardianship order<sup>1</sup>. Children who appear to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted.<sup>2</sup> Any child with a Education, Health and Care Plan.

When the school is oversubscribed, students will be admitted in the order of priority stated below:

- 1 Children from Church of England/Roman Catholic families whose application is supported by their priest or minister
- 2 Children from families belonging to other Churches that are members of 'Churches Together in Britain and Ireland' or the Evangelical Alliance whose application is supported<sup>2</sup> by their priest or minister
- 3 Children from families belonging to other Christian churches whose application is supported by their Church minister or leader
- 4 Children from families practising other world faiths whose application is supported by their spiritual leader
- 5 Children from other families in sympathy with the aims and ethos of this Christian school.

Within each of the above categories priority will be given firstly to those children who at the time of admission have a sibling at the school, secondly to those children applying on the basis of faith and then thirdly to those children who live nearest to the school.

Oversubscription priority may be given to the children of members of staff provided they have been employed at St Bede's Inter-Church School for a minimum of two years and/or are recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skills shortage.

The application process for admissions into Year 7 is co-ordinated by Cambridgeshire Local Authority (LA), which acts on behalf of the governing body to offer places at the school. Parents should submit a Common Application Form, available from their child's primary school or from the LA Admissions Team, by the LA published date. Offer letters will be issued by the LA on 1 March each year. Late applications (those submitted outside of the LA published dates) will be handled by the Admissions Team.

All parents wishing to apply under the school's religious criteria must also complete the attached Supplementary Information Form. This must be returned to the School by the LA application deadline or, for mid-phase applications, at the same time as the school's application form is submitted.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> A looked after child is a child who is in the care of a local authority in England, or is being provided with accommodation by a local authority in England in the exercise of their social services functions.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> A child is regarded as having been in state care in a place outside of England if they were accommodated by a public authority, a religious organisation or any other provider of care whose sole purpose is to benefit society.
